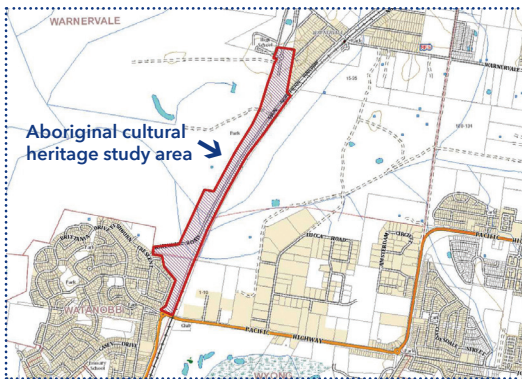
Aboriginal Heritage – Warnervale Link Road Proposal

Roads and Maritime Services invites Aboriginal people and Aboriginal groups who hold cultural knowledge relevant to determining the significance of Aboriginal objects and places for the Warnervale Link Road Proposal to register to be consulted.

Roads and Maritime Services is investigating the feasibility of providing a link road between Wyong and Warnervale. The Central Coast Regional Plan 2036 identifies Warnervale as a regional growth centre. The link road would service the expected traffic growth arising from housing and employment development in the area. Roads and Maritime is continuing the investigations originally commenced by Central Coast Council to consider its feasibility, develop the road corridor and commence planning for the future link.

The proposal may result in the Roads and Maritime Services:

- applying for an Aboriginal Heritage Impact Permit (AHIP) under Part 6 of the *National Parks and Wildlife Act 1974*, and/or
- undertaking investigations in accordance with the *Code of practice for archaeological investigations in NSW 2010*, and/or
- carrying out an environmental impact assessment under the *Environmental Planning & Assessment Act 1979*.
